John Young attended Loyola University School of Law and received his Bachelor of Public Administration, in May 1979. He furthered his education at Loyola University and received a Juris Doctor in May 1982.

He has served as the District Attorney for Jefferson Parish from February 1997 to January 2004, then went on to serve on the Jefferson Parish Council from January 7, 2004 till October 13, 2010. On October 13, 2010 he was elected as the President of Jefferson Parish and serves till this day.

The state's most populous parish and home to two of its largest employers, Jefferson Parish stretches from the south shore of Lake Pontchartrain to the Gulf of Mexico at Grand Isle, making it the business gateway to the region. It owes a great deal of its commercial success to the Mississippi River, which flows through the parish, and boasts an exceptional transportation infrastructure including large port operations, major railways, and the Louis Armstrong New Orleans International Airport in the city of Kenner.
