<u>PROGRAM - APRIL 21, 2015</u> <u>BOB BECKER, CITY PARK</u>

Bob Becker is the CEO of New Orleans City Park. Becker, who earned a doctorate in urban studies at UNO in 2006, has been the 1,300-acre park's chief executive officer for 11 years. In early 2005, Bob led the team to create the Park's Master Plan for the future: City Park 2018.

He was at the helm in August of 2005, when hurricane Katrina and the failure of the federal levees, in his words, 'annihilated the Park.' After Hurricane, Becker assembled a public-private financing plan that has raised more than \$100 million for storm recovery and implementing the park's master plan. He led the team to push through the devastation and to keep pushing the Master Plan forward. Bob made a vow saying, "We're going to make it better than it was before. We're going to build a world class Park."

Bob is still at the Park's helm pushing forward. At the employee lunch marking the 5th Anniversary of Katrina Bob said, "People like to get behind winners. City Park is a winner."

On October 21, 2014 Bob Becker received a Lifetime Achievement Award from the Bureau of Governmental Research.
